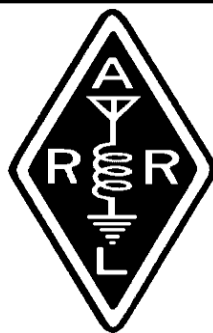

The Aug 25 ARRL Letter notes that the ARES activities stood down 20 Aug.

The earthquake in Italy has taken its toll both in casualties and in property damage. Please keep 7060 LSB (+/- 10 kHz), 3760,

7045, 3643, and 3580 kHz (PSK) open during this time and keep them in your thoughts.

A Simple 2 Meter Ground Plane Antenna

Over the years there have been several articles written concerning the construction of 2 meter antennas for use with local repeaters. One of the simplest designs I have seen consists of some #12 or #14 copper wire and a panel mounting SO 239 connector (Fig. 1).

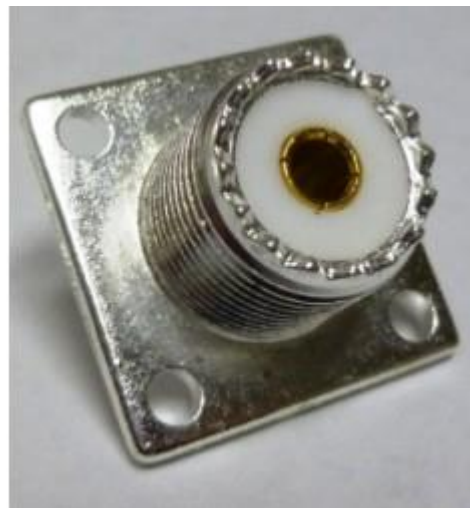

Cut a length of copper wire (#12 or #14) about 20 inches long and solder it to the center pin (See Fig. 2, label A). This will be the vertical radiator. Cut four lengths of copper wire for radials at a length of about 20.5 inches. These will be attached to the four mounting holes in the SO 239 connector and angled at about 45 degrees (Fig. 2, labels B,C,D, and E).

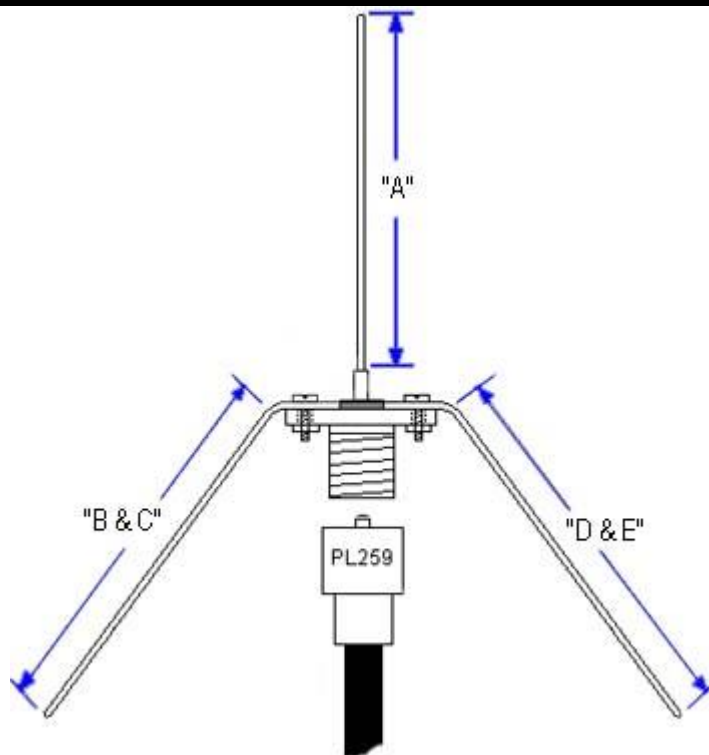

The radials can be attached using small bolts and nuts or they can be soldered. If you choose to use bolts then a small loop can be formed at one end of each radial and the bolt can be inserted through this loop and the mounting hole in the SO 239. A feed line consisting of 52 ohm coax and a PL 259 connector can be used to bring your 2 meter signal to the antenna.

The vertical element may be a little long so you can trim the vertical element carefully to bring the SWR down to where you would like it to be. The length of the radials isn't critical.

You can mount this little ground plane on a pole or you can make a small hook at the top of the vertical element and hoist the antenna using a string over a limb.

If there is enough interest we can have a building program at one of our NARC meetings and have those interested build this little antenna. We can have an SWR meter and a 2 meter rig at the meeting and trim the antenna to frequency. Please let us know at a future meeting or with an email so we can plan accordingly.
