Army AE5P showed the Byonics Microtracker TNC / 2M transmitter and micro-GPS that will be used to track via APRS the Timpson ISD balloon on their next launch.

Jim WA5GVQ showed his SPOT transmitter that uses LEO satellites to relay messages from anywhere in the world to a website. Some balloon programs have used these for backup tracking in addition to APRS

Program:

Army AE5P presented a program on balloon tracking software developed and used by a group in Colorado. In addition to being able to track the balloon via APRS, the software also permits a balloon flight path and

landing prediction to be calculated using high altitude wind data from the National Weather Service.
