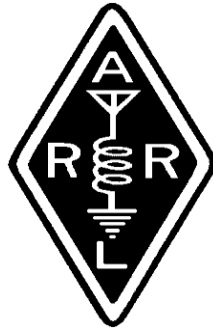

A Three Element 2 Meter Quad

In the last article we discussed a two element quad antenna for 2 meters. This consisted of a driven element and a reflector. We can increase the gain if we add an element to the antenna on the opposite side of the driven element that is slightly shorter in circumference than the driven element and spaced an appropriate distance from the driven element. The spacing of this element is such that it will reradiate the signal from the driven element to reinforce the signal that is radiating from the driven element/reflector pair. This added element is usually called a director. See Fig. 1.

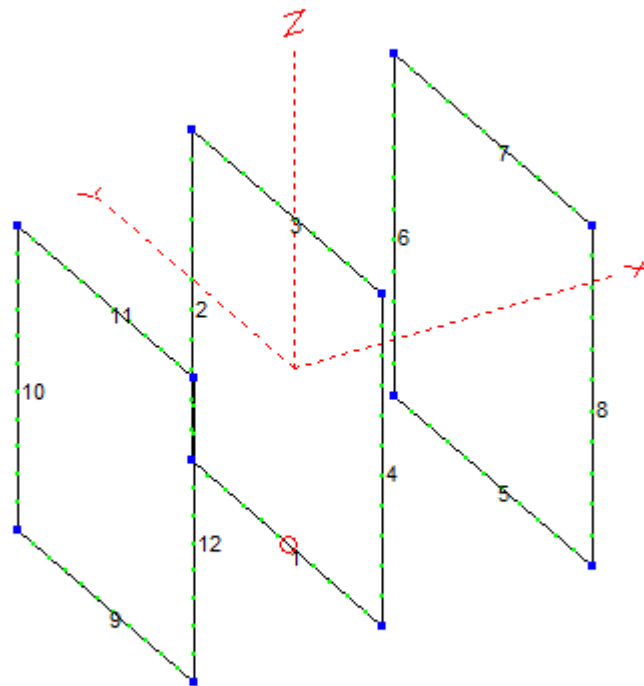

The director in Fig. 1 consists of wires 9, 10, 11, and 12. Maximum radiation occurs in the direction from the reflector through the driven element toward the director. In

Fig. 1 this is from right to left. In this simulation each side of the director is 1.6 feet long and the distance between the driven element and the director is 1 foot. The azimuth plot is shown in Fig. 2.

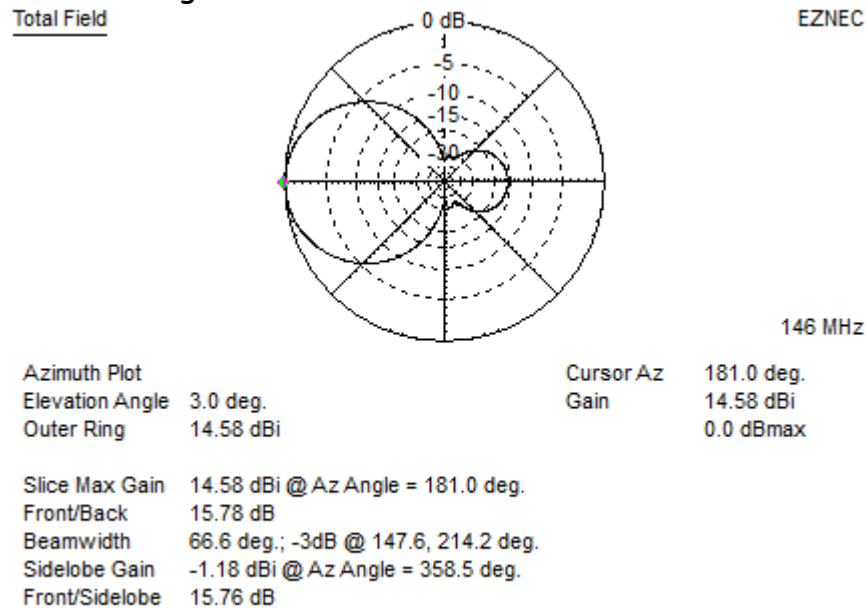

The SWR plot from 144 MHz to 148 MHz is shown in Fig. 3.

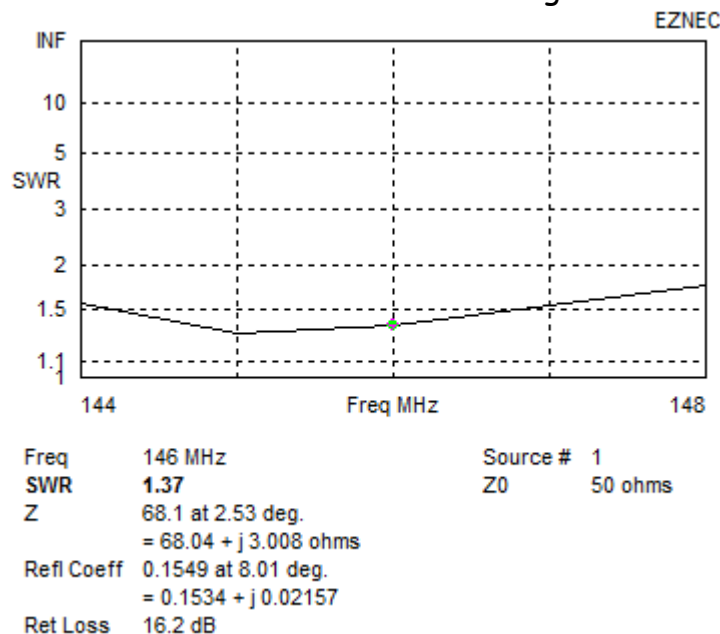

It is interesting to note that in this simulation $Z_0 = 50$ ohms. This means we should be able to feed this antenna directly with 50 ohm coax.

Remember, if you want vertical polarization you need to feed the antenna on one of the vertical wires. If you want horizontal polarization, feed the antenna on a horizontal wire. Notice that Fig. 1 shows the feed point as the red circle on wire 1. That means we have horizontal polarization.
